

Evaluation Questionnaire / Feedback

This report shows the results obtained from the questionnaire provided during the 3rd ANYWHERE workshop. The workshop, organised by INTC (Catalan Civil Protection) and UPC-CRAHI, was attended by a total of 231 people distributed as follows:

- 138 externals, from 104 different organisations, belonging to 24 countries.
- 93 partners, from 33 different organisations, belonging to 11 countries.

12. I benefit the least from *:

- Posters session (8).
- Role-playing game scenario (AnyCare). I failed to understand the purpose of it or how is related to Anywhere (was not clear and it seemed poorly organized).
- As the project is still ongoing, key aspects that are yet to be determined, such as future pricing for Anywhere services.
- Late dinners were less appealing for me personally as I tend to have dinner at an earlier time.
- Roundtable discussion about forest fires
- Maybe too much time for break out discussions.

13. Personal comments and suggestion to improve the workshop:

- Make the lunch and coffee breaks smaller and more international suitable (5).
- Posters. Include a short poster pitch (1-2 mins) to make it more appealing (4).
- Even more clear information about the workshop and the facilities where different actions take place especially when there are parallel sessions (2).
- The only thing I'd improve is a little "who is who" at the beginning of the first day (2).
- More hands-on training activities to learn to interpret some of the information included at the platform. Maybe trying to work on same case with the different platforms (3).
- The programme was too packed up. I would be nice to finish a little earlier each day in the afternoon (2).
- Round table for Civil Protection and Fire and Rescue/ end users.
- Demonstrations should be supported by roll-up displays or similar measures to provide guidance.
- The lunches. Having lunch standing up was not pleasant.
- Posters. Please consider poster session for next workshop.
- Posters. More space between sections of posters (little groups collapsed the space).
- I wish events of these kind would happen more often or at least would last a day or two longer.
- The breaks for coffee / lunch were quite long and some shortening might be bearable.
- Thank you for outstanding hospitality! :-)
- I have found the workshop very interesting and well organized.
- Even though the focus on A4EU was excellent, MH-EWS and the algorithms below should be presented in a more visible or more systematic way (in discussions with externals it would have been good to be able to start with the platform and move to elements behind dependent on interests).
- Very happy with the organization, the speakers and the general mood of the workshop.
- A special thanks to Workshop Local Organizing Committee (UPC-CRAHI and Catalonia Civil Protection) for making the workshop interesting and fruitful related to the overall theme on how to connect Anywhere platform and Local needs!
